BZBI has released a complete Guide to this year's High Holy Day services; you can access it on our Worship webpage. Some highlights:

During most services, **Childcare and Youth & Family** activities are available, but space must be reserved in advance. We are utilizing Kahaner Auditorium and other rooms in the building. The deadline to reserve your child's (or children's) spot is **Monday, August 23**, and the reservation form is located here.

Sukkot begins on Monday evening, September 20. The cost to order a personal Lulav and Etrog set is the same as last year at \$54 per set, and the deadline to place orders is Friday, August 27. Click here to order your set.
