

Neziner Hebrew School is Hiring Madrichim

The word, *madrichim* means guides. At BZBI, *madrichim* are teens (at least 14 years old) who work alongside Hebrew School teachers as teaching assistants, helping to enhance the experience of our students and serving as Jewish role models.

Madrichim also join a limited number of group training / mentorship sessions to reflect on their experience and grow as young Jewish educators. This is a great way for teens to learn new skills and earn a little money.
