## **Character Paths and the Heart's Commitments**

Wednesdays, February 2 - March 2 from 7:00 - 8:00 PM

Rabbi Yitzhak Hutner (1906-1980), a leader of America's Haredi (ultra-Orthodox) community, was one of the most original and challenging thinkers in Jewish history. His writings, collected under the heading of *hilkhot de'ot ve-hovot ha-levavot* (Character Paths and the Heart's Commitments), use the Jewish holidays as a framework for understanding deeper levels of Jewish spiritual experience.

Join Rabbi Abe as we dive into Rav Hutner's teachings on *Pesah*. *English translation will be offered for all texts and no prior experience is required.* The five-week class is \$18 for BZBI members and \$36 for the general community. *Register here*, and a Zoom link will be sent to you before the first class.




### **Introduction to Mindfulness**


