Priority Enrollment for BZBI Summer Camp

Ends Friday, February 18, 2022

Priority enrollment for the 8-week summer camp at BZBI Early Childhood Education is open until tomorrow evening for current and incoming families, as well as synagogue members. Children from 18 months through Pre-K can apply. After February 18, we open enrollment to the larger community, as well as children entering Kindergarten, to fill open spots.

Camp runs from Wednesday, June 22 through Friday, August 12 with spots guaranteed for 8-week commitments.
