Shabbat Learning: Ukraine and Purim in an Upside-Down World

Cathryn Miller-Wilson, Executive Director of HIAS Pennsylvania, joins us this Shabbat for a discussion of the situation in Ukraine and how Americans can help Ukrainian refugees as well as over 80 million other refugees worldwide.

Cathryn has been HIAS Pennsylvania's Executive Director since November 2016. She graduated from the University of Pennsylvania Law School and currently sits on the law school's Board of Managers. In 2004 she was awarded the Penn Law Alumni Society's Young Alumni Award for Professional Achievement.

We are also heading into the week of Purim, and many have rightfully asked how we can expect to celebrate joyously in a time of suffering and death. After Cathryn speaks, Rabbi Abe will reflect on how the specific themes and messages of Purim can actually lead us toward a constructive response to a world in crisis. 

Project Home and Bethesda Project have received 88 Caps for Keppies, 53 pairs of Gloves of Love, and 77 Soft Scarves. In addition, 50 belts and 12 wallets were donated.

Packages of new socks and men's undershirts will continue to be collected. Since November 2021 we have donated 128 pairs of socks and 12 mens' undershirts. The knitting hats and scarves will continue year-round and the next collection drive begins in the fall of 2022.
