We can all use a little perspective from time to time. It's natural to get caught up in the daily rush of commitments and concerns, to lose sight of the broader context of our lives. Once in a while, it helps to take a step back and reflect on the big picture.

This week brought us a very big picture indeed. The release of the first deep field image from the James Webb Space Telescope offers a reminder that the entirety of human history – all of our striving, our failures and our accomplishments – accounts for barely three millionths of the span of the universe. It calls to mind Carl Sagan's reaction to Voyager 1's final picture of Earth from 4 billion miles away: "Our posturings, our imagined self-importance, the delusion that we have some privileged position in the Universe, are challenged by this point of pale light."

And yet Judaism also teaches us that each human being is a universe in and of itself. To save a life is to save the world, our Talmud teaches; to help one person is to help the vast interconnected points of light of our galaxy. The Webb Telescope also teaches us that, at our best, humanity can pull off incredible feats of creativity, innovation, and daring. Thousands of people, working for hundreds of companies and agencies in 29 states and 14 countries across three continents, spent twenty years developing the technologies, systems, and processes that allow the Webb Telescope to produce the breathtaking images we saw this week. The challenge before humanity is whether we will choose to apply the same determination and ingenuity that launched the Webb mission in order to solve problems much closer to home.
