BZBI has a limited number of guest tickets available. These may only be purchased by BZBI members for relatives who reside outside of the Greater Philadelphia area and are visiting for the holidays. <u>You must be a member in good standing to purchase guest tickets.</u> Tickets are for the entire holiday and cannot be prorated.

Families with kids and teens may now register their children for High Holiday youth programming and childcare. Your kids are invited to hang out with friends, participate in age-appropriate holiday youth services, and participate in experiential learning about Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur through games, interactive discussions, and other fun activities. Please register your kids before September 12 at noon. Registration is required to participate.

BZBI High Holiday Guide to Services

All services will be held in BZBI's Goldberg Sanctuary except as noted on the schedule. For Kol Nidre, we will offer two services, in the Goldberg Sanctuary and in the Kahaner Auditorium.

Zoom and Facebook Live will also be available for all services in the Goldberg Sanctuary.

Rabbi Abe Friedman and Rabbi Abi Weber will lead our High Holy Day services, with Gedalia Penner Robinson as ba'al tefillah (prayer leader).

We are all aware that the current public health situation is fluid and could change at any time. At present, we have enough seating in the Sanctuary to accommodate all BZBI members who want to attend in person.

Please note the following health and safety guidelines for this year's High Holy Days:

Everyone aged 2 and older entering BZBI must wear a mask covering the nose and mouth, with limited exceptions for Torah readers, prayer leaders, and other roles specifically designated.

If you are unvaccinated, immunocompromised, or do not feel you can fully abide by these guidelines, we ask that you participate using Zoom or Facebook Live.

<u>Zoom Services</u> will be live streamed simultaneously from the Goldberg Sanctuary using the same functionality as last year. We always welcome you on Zoom. All members are invited to <u>register</u> here for services.

<u>Facebook Live Services</u> will be offered at the same time as Zoom services and freely available to the general public. You do not need to be a member of BZBI to attend. Simply go to the <u>BZBI Facebook page</u> and click on the live video link any time during the service.

BZBI Weekday and Shabbat Services

All are welcome to attend BZBI's multi-access Shabbat and weekday religious services in-person. This includes Kabbalat Shabbat in Fitler Square at 7:30 PM on Fridays during the summer months (or the Klinghoffer Chapel if inclement weather is forecast) and Shabbat services in the Goldberg Sanctuary on Saturdays at 9:30 AM.

On weekdays, BZBI holds multi-access services in the Klinghoffer Chapel on Sunday (9:00 AM), Monday (5:45 PM except civil holidays), and Thursday (7:45 AM, 9:00 AM on civil holidays). On other weekdays, BZBI offers zoom-only services at 7:45 AM, 9:00 AM on civil holidays, and 8:30 PM.

We ask that once inside our building, you observe BZBI's rules, which were put in place with the guidance of our COVID task force, the city of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania:

Everyone aged 2 and older entering BZBI must wear a mask covering nose and mouth, with limited exceptions for Torah readers, prayer leaders, and other roles specifically designated by our Rabbis.

We also ask that you pledge for yourself and those with whom you may be attending that you will not attend any service or program at BZBI if you, or those attending with you, experience any of the potential indicators listed below, or are awaiting the results of a COVID-19 test:

- continuous or intermittent cough
- shortness of breath
- fever or feel feverish (with or without chills)
- sore throat
- headache
- muscle aches or muscle pain
- recent loss of the sense of taste or smell
- fatigue
- congestion or a runny nose
- recent nausea, vomiting or diarrhea
- exposure in the last 14 days to someone with a cold, flu contagious illness, or suspicion of COVID-19
