Registration for High Holy Day youth programming and childcare

High Holy Day childcare and youth programming is available during service times for children and teens ages 2-years-old through high school. All childcare/youth programming attendees <u>must click here to pre-register</u> by Monday, September 12, at noon.

Registration is mandatory to participate in childcare/holiday programming. To participate, all children must be *fully potty trained and able to wear a mask at all times*.

Parents or guardians may **NOT** leave the building while their two-year-old through 7th grade children are in childcare/youth programming. Children in 7th grade and older may check in and out of childcare on their own without an adult; Children in 6th grade and younger must be checked in and out by a parent/guardian or another adult designated on the registration form.
