






# Tot Shabbat Park Playdate

High Holy Days Food Drive

Friday, September 15 through Sunday, October 8

This has been a challenging year for families facing financial hardship, compounded by SNAP assistance ending this past February. Food insecurity is significantly higher among those at or below poverty thresholds, with 46% of Jewish households that are at or below 200% of the federal poverty index identified as food insecure.

The continuation of providing food access is critical, and the Mitzvah Food Program invites you to support the pantries in three ways:

- Drop off canned goods and non perishables at BZBI. Please do not bring glass jars, open packages, or expired items. All food items can be dropped off in the box provided in the **18th Street lobby**.
- Purchase grocery store gift cards to be distributed directly to clients so that they can choose the items they need from their local grocery store. We recommend gift cards from ShopRite,
  Acme and Giant, as these are the stores that are most easily accessible. Gift card values up to \$50 are the most helpful. Please bring gift cards to Aleksandra in the office.
- Purchase foods through the <u>Mitzvah Food Program</u> <u>Amazon wish lists</u> so that the products are shipped directly to a pantry.
