How You Can Help:

Wondering how you can help Israel directly? The Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia has set up an <u>emergency response fund</u> to aid in relief efforts.

Donations will help fund:

• Shelter and psychological trauma support for 15,000 people who have been displaced.

• Training for additional emergency personnel is needed to replace the first responders who have been murdered or kidnapped.

• Equipment for additional emergency personnel, including protective vests, flashlights and first aid kits.
